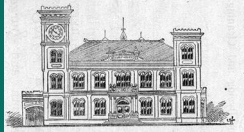

First and very importantly, as you may have seen in last Friday's media accounts, I am pleased to say that the ADD Board has reached a legal settlement with the former master developer of the New Orleans Riverside at Federal City facility that breaks a legal impasse and allows us to move forward more quickly and professionally toward significant new development progress. We are very excited that these legal encumbrances have now been removed and that we can again turn our aggressive attention to making the full promise of the Federal City site a reality.

Look for more on these important step over the next few months.

ADD is pleased to announce that the LSU Foundation has officially celebrated the ribbon cutting and grand opening of the LSU Health Fitness and Wellness Center.

I would also like to take this opportunity to update you on various pieces of legislation which I have introduced this session that addresses the needs of our community and serves to improve the quality of life for the people of Algiers.

Health and Healthcare

- SB264 requires public safety telecommunicators who provide emergency dispatch to be trained in delivering telephone CPR.
- SB156 provides immunity from liability for person providing gratuitous emergency care to a minor or domestic animal.
- SB556 provides relative to information and access to breast reconstructive services where every hospital licensed to provide mastectomy surgery, etc. shall provide information to the patient concerning the option of reconstructive surgery.

Gun Control

- SB383 details the monitoring of ammunition purchasing including signature in a log book, providing photo ID, and a computer database.
- SB491 prohibits the importation, manufacture, sale, purchase, possession, or transfer of rapid-fire devices.

Animal Welfare

- SB485 prohibits the raffle or giving away of certain animals as a novelty or prize at a carnival or fair (iguanas, pot-bellied pigs, and reptiles).
- SB160 prohibits tying or tethering a dog or cat in extreme weather conditions.

Fiscal Matters

- SB553 provides people who make low alcohol content beverages to be able to sell their product at retail as long as they own the business at which they are selling it.
- SB162 provides an increase for state minimum wage.

Infrastructure

- SB460 repeals termination date of New Orleans Ferry Fund.

Personal Rights

- SB392 discusses the rights and relations of adopted children to their birth parents.

Justice Reform

- SB269 provides parole eligibility for certain prisoners

sentenced to life who have served at least 30 years.
