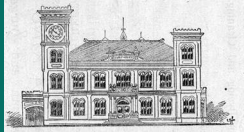

A message from your Chairman: Sen. Troy A. Carter



It has been a very busy time at the Capitol for the Legislature, but I am proud to report back with a full run-down of everything that was accomplished.

For all intents and purposes, the Louisiana Legislature had been in official legislative session since mid-February beginning with the 1st Special Session, then moving right into the Regular Session which ended before its scheduled adjournment date to make way for yet another session, the 2nd Special Session of 2018.

The 1st Special Session aimed at addressing an expected \$1 billion plus budget shortfall produced no solutions.

While legislators did approve an operating budget with the revenues available, the approved budget funded vital nursing home care, services for the disabled and elderly and TOPS at the expense of every other governmental function.

At the regular session lawmakers also addressed school safety, hazing crimes, crimes against the elderly, abortion restrictions, expansion of the allowable uses of medical marijuana, sexual harassment in the government workplace, modernization of the state's gaming laws, changes in state jury laws and more.

Lawmakers approved the renewal of a portion of the penny sales tax that was set to expire July 1, 2018 and agreed to provide some stability to state finances by continuing the renewed sales tax for seven years, through June 30, 2025. The renewal of a part of the expiring penny sales tax allowed for the restoration of all but about \$43 million in proposed cuts to state agencies and programs.

Lawmakers were able to complete the work of the 3rd Special Session in just 7 days, ending three days before the required June 27th adjournment.
