## State of Louisiana's Investment in Delgado Community College Westbank Campus Advanced Technology Center Accelerates Development Progress for Algiers Development District at New Orleans Riverside at Federal City

On Wednesday, August 8, Governor John Bel Edwards announced an historic partnership between the Algiers Development District and Delgado Community College, which will make possible the development of a Delgado Advanced Technology Building at New Orleans Riverside at Federal City in Algiers. This historic partnership makes use of 35,000 square feet for the new facility and the capacity to provide instruction for 2,000 students.

The collaboration aims to make more coursework options available on the Westbank campus and expand opportunities for more people to succeed through on-going education. Plans for the campus surround an Advanced Technology Building with a focus on training and education in the fields of production, engineering, and maintenance. The expansion will serve as a workforce pipeline for the industrial needs of the West Bank community, providing more opportunities for the community to contribute to the area's economic growth and preventing needless commutes across the river.

"The Algiers Development District Board and people of Algiers are excited to welcome the expansion of Delgado's presence in Algiers," said Development District Chair of the Board Senator Troy Carter. "This announcement and significant investment represent great news for New Orleans' west bank and are a testament to the future economic promise and vitality of the area. We look forward to continuing our important collaboration with Delgado and are grateful to Governor Edwards and the legislature for this visionary investment."

"It helps to be able to get your education in close proximity to where you are," said Gov. Edwards at Wednesday's press conference announcing the new capital outlay. "This is just another way of giving an opportunity to people to be successful wherever they live in Louisiana."

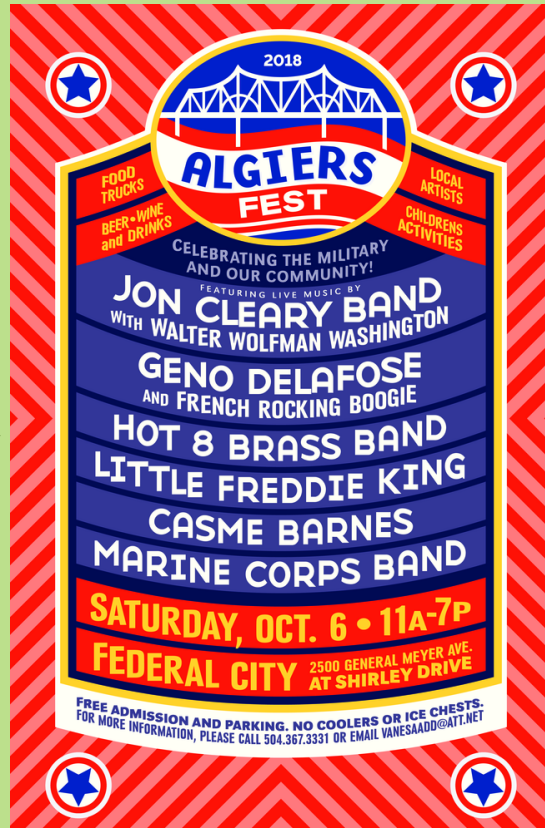
