





Community Impact - University of Holy Cross



Since 1916, the University of Holy Cross (UHC) has been an important part of the Algiers community. As a Ministry of the Marianites of Holy Cross, a Catholic congregation of women dedicated to service in the name of Jesus, UHC is guided by their beliefs and approach to life.

One of the Marianites core beliefs is that it is the University's commitment to enlighten the "whole person," to educate both the heart and the mind. Students of UHC leave with not only the knowledge and skills needed to succeed in their career, but also understand true success comes through service to others.

This valuable life lesson is taught and practiced

throughout all the University's disciplines. One such example is the University's Counseling and Training Center. For more than 25 years, the University has provided counseling services to the broader community.

"It is experiential learning and a win-win for our masters students as well as the community," said Dr. Stanton McNeely, president of the University of Holy Cross. "Our Masters students gain real-world experience and credit toward becoming a licensed counselor, but more importantly, we're able to provide a vital social service that has the additional benefit of making our community stronger."

Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, UHC's counseling services cost \$15/session. However, since the pandemic began in March, the University eliminated its fee and adapted its services to telehealth so it could continue to safely provide counseling to the community and not have cost be a factor.

Louisiana State Senate Supports Law Enforcement and Rejects Notion of Police Defunding



On October 27, the Louisiana Senate passed Senate Resolution 54, which expresses the Senate's stance to continue to support the police and other law enforcement. The decision was both unanimous and bipartisan, and renounced the notion that these departments were to be defunded in any way.

"The law enforcement community in this state does an outstanding job of protecting and serving our citizens. They deserve our support and this resolution is our humble attempt to show them how appreciated they truly are...any effort to defund police will cause irreparable and lasting damage to our safety and security. While there are instances of bad behavior by police officers, the overwhelming majority of law enforcement in this state are indeed outstanding peacekeepers."

The resolution was led by District 7 State Senator Troy Carter.
