groundbreaking of the first
residential housing
development at New Orleans
Riverside at Federal City
alongside friends and
neighbors.



This new independent senior living development promises to be another flagship development for Algiers and the Greater New Orleans area providing much-needed affordable housing to our senior and veteran community. Planned over two phases, phase one is anticipated to take approximately 18 months to complete. Phase two, expected to begin in the later part of 2024, will involve the historic renovation and revitalization of the existing building at Guadalcanal and Hebert Drive across from the Algiers Auditorium.

Brown-Taylor will also begin construction in the second half of 2024 on another major historic renovation into market-rate apartments between Sanctuary and Coral Sea Streets. In total, these projects will bring 156 muchneeded housing units to the Federal City campus.

It's tremendously gratifying to see all the years of dedication and hard work from our current and past leadership come to fruition. Federal City continues to be a vibrant and growing community.

Strengthening Communities in New Orleans: FORTIFIED Gold Standards for Resilient Housing



Representatives from Brown Taylor Development, Westside Development, and the Algiers Development District (ADD) recently marked a significant milestone with the groundbreaking of a pioneering phase for an independent senior living development at New Orleans Riverside at Federal City.

The new construction, built to the Fortified Gold Standard - a rigorous construction standard geared towards enhancing resilience against severe weather conditions - will introduce 70 affordable housing units designed for senior and veteran residents.

Our partnership with Westside Development and the Algiers Development District, and with the support of the Louisiana Housing Corporation, is a testament to our shared vision of creating sustainable and inclusive housing solutions. We're proud to contribute to the growth and revitalization of this historic area," said Edward Taylor, Brown-Taylor Development.

Recognizing the vulnerability of the Federal City location in New Orleans to storms and the need to protect its residents, the district is embracing the Fortified Gold standard as a cornerstone of its development strategy.

Fortified Gold is emerging as the optimal solution for buildings in New Orleans, especially for housing senior residents and ensuring long-term habitation. This designation, awarded by the Insurance Institute for Business & Home Safety (IBHS), signifies the highest level of resilience against severe weather events, including hurricanes.

One of the key advantages of Fortified Gold is its ability to maintain a constant supply of power, even during severe weather events. This feature not only ensures the comfort of residents but also prevents the growth of mold, a common issue in the aftermath of such events. The climate-controlled environment becomes crucial, particularly for senior residents and long-term housing.

Fortified Gold also includes all the requirements of Fortified Roof. This encompasses enhanced nailing, a sealed roof deck and locked-down edges. These features collectively offer homes the best chance of weathering a storm, making Fortified Gold a comprehensive and effective solution for building resilience.

The ADD board, under the guidance of Brown Taylor Development, has strongly endorsed the Fortified Gold standard. This commitment is a strategic move to enable residents to stay in their homes during severe weather events. Even in the case of mandatory evacuations, returning residents will experience minimal loss, fostering a sense of security and stability.

As part of its broader commitment to community development, ADD is actively working on expanding and improving New Orleans Riverside at Federal City. Embracing the Fortified Gold standard is a key component of this development initiative.


