

**1992:** The Algiers Development District, ADD, was created by state statute. The legislation was authored and passed by then-Louisiana State Representative and now-United States Congressman Troy A. Carter, Sr. This act gave birth to a vibrant economic engine for Algiers and the surrounding communities.

**2005:** ADD successfully saved the Naval Support Activity military base from closure through the nationwide Base Realignment and Closure, or BRAC, process. A few days before Hurricane Katrina hit Louisiana, ADD was informed that our efforts as well as those from the Algiers Economic Development Foundation, our community members and elected officials in the State of Louisiana “saved the base”.

**2006:** ADD and the district committed their efforts to rebuilding and reorganizing New Orleans post-Katrina years.

**2007:** Built and installed “Welcome to Algiers” signs in five of the major entrances to the community with landscaping to create a sense of community and pride for Algiers residents.

**2008:** Officials break ground at Federal City ceremonially beginning construction.

**2009:** The Federal City project begins. To date, it is the largest economic development program in the State of Louisiana

**2010:** The ADD partnered with the City of New Orleans to complete two new road extensions into the Federal City complex at Opelousas and Patterson and holds a ribbon cutting ceremony to officially open Woodland Drive to the public.

**2011:** Federal City opens the new national headquarters for Marine Forces Reserve and Marine Forces North. The Naval Support Activity gives a 21-gun salute to honor the nation’s 235th birthday.

**2012:** Federal City dedicates new YMCA fitness center and Bike and Hike Path

**2013:** ADD acquires land on Federal City from the US Department of Navy. Phase 1 of the Federal City project, the Military Phase, is completed which included MARFORRES Gym, Childcare Center, and new state-of-the-art auditorium.

**2014:** New Orleans Military & Maritime Academy Campus opens.

**2015:** Inaugural celebration of the first annual Algiers Fest honoring our military and Algiers community.

**2016:** Delgado Student Life Center opens in the former Naval Chapel and \$6.0M LSU Health Fitness Center Expansion – Addition of: Swimming Pool, Locker Rooms and Additional Fitness Areas.

**2017:** Water meter installations complete and Entergy comprehensive LED lighting installations complete.

**2018:** Louisiana Governor John Bel Edwards announces ACT 360 state funds for Delgado Advanced Technology Center. Made possible by then Louisiana State Senator and now United States Congressman Troy A. Carter, Sr. and then Louisiana State Representative and now Louisiana State Senator Gary Carter, Jr.

**2019:** Clara’s Little Lambs Child Development Center opens at Federal City with the support of then Louisiana State Senator and now United States Congressman Troy A. Carter, Sr. and the Delgado Advanced Technology Center Groundbreaking.

**2020:** Delgado Advanced Technology Center construction commences, and Synergy Physical Therapy & Performance opens at LSU Health Fitness Center.

**2021:** Delgado Advanced Technology Center Opening Ceremony and completed installation of new solar lights on the Levee Bike, Jogging, Walking Path.

**2022:** Brown Builders Building 4 Purchase and Sale Agreement executed.

**2023:** First Algiers Mardi Gras Festival at Federal City and executed final agreements on NOMMA three expansion parcels and the long-term lease of the Fitness Center.

**2024:** Groundbreaking Ceremony for The Riverside Lofts at Federal City and Executed FY 2023 COMMUNITY PROJECT FUNDING GRANT AGREEMENT NO. B-23-CP-LA-062. The \$4M HUD Grant funding was appropriated to the Algiers Development District by United States Congressman Troy A. Carter, Sr. for the Cut-Off Pool/Natatorium project.

**2025:** Ribbon Cutting and Grand Opening of the Riverside Retreat, a 70-unit mixed income independent senior residence.

**2026:** Fourth Algiers Mardi Gras Festival at Federal City and Cut-off Pool/Natatorium Groundbreaking Ceremony, hosted by United States Congressman Troy A. Carter, Sr.
